We once again place a part onto our 2018 symbol of a heart. This heart represents how we are a loving community that grows together. On our Feast Day at Holy Cross, we spread the love.

Purple

Purple is a cool, calming colour and is one of our two school colours. To us it represents hope. Purple is the colour of royalty and reminds us of the Kingdom of heaven. Purple is the colour of creativity, wisdom, dignity and peace.

Beaded String

If you look closely, you will notice a string of beads that weaves its way around the heart.
